If any one class has more than three Tb and three Tb type/Sport Horse entrants, that class will be divided Tb and Tb type/Sport Horse classes.

All entrants must comply with NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets Part 350 Standards of Conduct for Fairs and Genesee Valley Breeders requirements (see attachments). All TIP entrants must comply with the TIP Jockey Club requirements.

Prize money will be awarded as follows:

28. Jockey Club TIP In-Hand - open to all Thoroughbreds of any age To be judged on conformation and way of going at a jog. Jockey Club Award and Ribbons for 1st through 6th place TIP

29. Get of Stallion open to any group of two or more with single or multiple ownership (entries permitted day of show)

30. Produce of Mare open to any group of two or more any age with single or multiple ownership (entries permitted day of show)

31. Handlers Class - open to Junior & Amateur Handlers - To be judged on the exhibitors ability to present their horse as professionally as possible. Conformation, type, movement not to be considered. Stallions are not eligible to participate. (entry fee \$10.00 and no prize money)

32. Leadline Class (no entry fee and no prize money)

33. Young Thoroughbred & Thoroughbred type/Sport Horse Suitable to Become a Hunter Under Saddle - Open to horses & Ponies five years of age and under (50% Performance & 50% Conformation) *Must be owned by a current member of the Genesee Valley Breeders Association.*

34. Genesee Valley Bred Hunter Under Saddle (50% Performance & 50% Conformation)
If entries warrant, class can be split by age of horse/pony.

35. *Jockey Club TIP Thoroughbred English Pleasure Walk, Trot, Canter

36. Open Conformation Hunter Under Saddle (50% Performance & 50% Conformation)

37. Thoroughbred & Thoroughbred Type/Sport Horse Hunter Hack - To jump a single 2' fence and work under saddle both directions of the ring.

38. Genesee Valley Hunt Classic - For members of the GVH to work both directions at walk, trot, canter and hand gallop and jump one line of fences at 2'6". To be judged on appointments and suitability in the field..

GVBA Rules and Regulations

1. All entrants in the Genesee Valley Bred Classes must have been foaled in, or out of a GV mare or sired by a stallion standing in the 31 western NYS counties In the GVBA territory. The counties in the GVBA Territory include: Allegheny, Broome, Cattaraugus, Cayuga, Chautauqua, Chemung, Chenango, Cortland, Erie, Genesee, Herkimer, Jefferson, Lewis, Livingston, Madison, Monroe, Niagara, Oneida, Onondaga, Ontario, Orleans, Oswego, Otsego, Schuylar, Seneca, Stuben, Tioga, Tompkins, Wayne, Wyoming, Yates.
2. A thoroughbred is any horse registered in any stud book recognized by the Jockey Club. A thoroughbred type/Sport Horse is any part thoroughbred or thoroughbred type.
3. All horses are to be judged on conformation, quality, substance and suitability to become or in the case of dams; apparent ability to beget hunter type. Transmissible unsoundness only to be considered in the case of broodmares. All in hand entries except foals are to be jogged for soundness.
4. Manners and Condition classes were originally designed to encourage breeders to employ sound feeding and management practices. This purpose remains. Mares should be well handled, carrying good weight commensurate with the age and demands of their foal. Concern for good coat and trimmed feet, with no excessive fat or evidence of being kept indoors and blanketed. Foals may be shown in halter, all other young horses and mares must be shown in chifney bit or bridle. Handler may be asked to walk or trot their animal on line and handle feet as well as entire body. Horses entered may be braided or unbraided and the length of manes and tails is at the practical discretion of the exhibitor/owner.
5. The administration of tranquilizers and or other prohibited medication is forbidden at this show. Any exhibitor understands and agrees to submit to a drug test for any animal at the discretion of the show. Any violation will cause suspension from the GVBA, forfeiture of any premiums and the withdrawal of any animals shown by or owned by that exhibitor.
6. Show management reserves the right to cancel, combine, split or reschedule any classes and to alter awards commensurate with the entries in that class.
7. Exhibitors in all classes must be attired in a workmanlike and professional manner. Handlers under the age of 14 are not permitted in on line classes other than Junior Handler.
8. Class fees are refundable only with a signed veterinary certificate. Stall fees are not refundable.
9. Coggins Test: In New York, any horse traveling off of the farm, needs **a current negative test for EIA (equine infectious anemia) within the last 2 calendar years(2023-2024)**. A copy of a Coggins test **MUST** be enclosed with entry. A copy of a

Veterinary Certificate of Immunization against Rabies within the past 12 months and EVH-1 within the past 6 months (if they meet the age parameters for the vaccine), MUST be enclosed with entry. All vaccinations must be veterinarian administered. No numbers will be issued until health papers are submitted. Health papers will not be returned. Do not send originals.

10. No entries accepted without payment in full..
11. Entrants must complete all requested entry data on each horse and sign the Waiver of Liability. Exhibitors winning more than \$600.00 must provide a completed W-9 form in order to receive payment of premiums. Premium awards will be mailed to exhibitors on or before October 30, 2024.
12. To qualify for TIP awards and points, entrants in TIP classes must be registered with the Jockey Club awards.
13. There will be personnel on grounds in the stable area from Saturday evening until show end.
14. Absolutely no driving or riding on the race track.
15. Class entry fee is \$40 per class for GVBA Members or \$60 per class for nonmembers. Entries received and paid in full by August 4th will receive a \$10 per class discount.
16. Stalls are available for \$75 per stall for Saturday after noon until the end of show on Sunday. Stalls reserved for just Sunday are \$60 per stall. Entries received by August 4th will have a \$10 discount applied to each stall fee. Bedding/Hay is available for purchase, please see the bedding order form.
17. To receive a stall/class discount, entries must be postmarked or received and paid in full by August 4th, 2024. Entries should be mailed to Bridle Path Manor, 3565 Howlett Hill Road, Camillus NY, 13031 or emailed to bpmhorseshow@gmail.com.
18. Breakfast and lunch services and an onsite EMT are being provided by the Avon Fire Department.
19. No dogs allowed on grounds unless carefully monitored and on leash at all times

Standards of Conduct for NYS Fairs

(a) All exhibits shall be entered in the name of the exhibit owner; provided, however, that any animal exhibit entered in a youth fair, youth exhibition, or 4-H show or exhibition may be entered in the name of the exhibitor.

(b) Exhibits shall have been owned by the exhibitor for a period of at least 30 days prior to entry of the exhibit; provided, however, that any animal exhibit entered in a youth fair, youth exhibition or 4-H show or exhibition shall have been in the care of the exhibitor for a period of at least 60 days prior to entry of the exhibit.

(c) Proof of ownership of any exhibit shall be provided by the exhibitor, upon request, to the fair sponsor.

(d) The fair sponsor may limit the number of breeds shown by any exhibitor.

(a) Animals demonstrating clinical signs or other evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall not be allowed on the fairgrounds during a fair.

(b) The commissioner may deny admission to, or require removal from the fair premises, or require the segregation of any animal affected with or exposed to any infectious, contagious or communicable disease.

(c) All animals presented for admission to a fair that originate from a location other than this State shall meet all State importation regulations appropriate to the species in addition to the requirements of this Part. State importation requirements can be obtained by contacting the department at [10B Airline Drive, Albany, NY 12235](mailto:10B_Airline_Drive@agriculture.ny.gov), (518) 457-3502, www.agriculture.ny.gov

(d) Animals originating from the State that qualify for admission under this Part at one fair shall be considered approved for admission at all other New York State fairs conducted during the same calendar year, subject to compliance with the rabies vaccination requirements of individual fairs, provided that the health status of the individual animal or the herd of origin does not change in the interim period. Imported animals entering a fair accompanied by an interstate certificate of veterinary inspection may utilize the same certificate at all other New York State fairs conducted during the same calendar year if the initial entry to a fair is within 30 days of issuance.

(e) In the event the commissioner issues a notice pursuant to New York State Agriculture and Markets Law, section 72 affecting an area which includes a

fairground, all animals presented for admission to that fair shall be in compliance with the disease control requirements of such notice.1 CRR-NY 351.3 Current through August 31, 2021

Thoroughbred Incentive Program

From the first T.I.P. event at Red Hills International Horse Trial in Florida on March 8, 2012 through the end of 2023, there were more than 10,400 horse shows and events with T.I.P. classes or awards held in 53 states and Canadian provinces. More than 89,000 eligible Thoroughbreds participated in these shows and events, competing for thousands of ribbons, hundreds of prizes and thousands of dollars in prize money simply for being a registered Thoroughbred.

All classes with * are TIP sponsored and sanctioned by the Jockey Club. For more information go to the Jockey Club TIP website. These TIP classes are listed as combined with “Open” but TIP and Open will be separately judged if there are three or more TIP entries and three or more Open in any of these classes

Following are the standards for the TIP Ranch classes:

· **Movement**The horse should demonstrate forward but controlled motion at each gait, including extended versions of the walk, trot, and lope. The horse's movement should simulate that of a working ranch horse needing to cover long distances quietly and softly. **Responsiveness**The horse should be responsive to the rider and make smooth, timely transitions between gaits. **Contact**The horse should be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein, but not with a full drape rein. The horse should be soft in the bridle and yield to contact. **Tack and attire**Classic Western dress is mandatory, but should be weather appropriate. Romal or split reins are required, and riders can wear chaps or leggings. Fake tails and hoof black are not permitted, and trimming ears and muzzle is discouraged.
